



Dr. Bryan S. Cline is the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) for Catholic Health East, a large faith-based health care system consisting of approximately 34 hospitals and dozens of other facilities in 11 states along the Eastern Seaboard. Former positions include CISO at The Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia, PA and Technical Director of Information Assurance (IA) Services for QinetiQ North America Defense Solutions in Stafford, VA. He has more than 25 years of experience in information systems, 10 years of which were in information systems security management and

engineering in the US Department of Defense (DoD) and North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO). Dr. Cline holds a Ph.D. in information systems with a concentration in IA policy from the University of Fairfax, Vienna, VA, an M.S. in industrial engineering with a concentration in operations research from the University of Oklahoma, and a B.S. in mathematics from the University of Texas at Arlington. His professional certifications include industrial (physical) and information security, program management, and systems and security engineering: CISSP-ISSEP, CISM, CISA, CPP, CAP (PM-II), ASEP, MCIAAT, NSA-IAM, and NSA-IEM.
